## **DIVISION II: DESIGN**

*“Holiday Joy”*

### **SECTION A:**

#### **Class 1: Novice - All Fresh** **(4 exhibits)**

*A design using fresh plant material with no wood, palm spathes, or other dried materials, staged on a white or cream covered table, 24' wide X 30" deep. Only those, who have never won a blue ribbon, may enter.*

#### **Class 2: Designer's Choice** **(4 exhibits)**

*A design using designer's choice of material, incorporating a holiday object. Must include some fresh materials but may include dried, wood, and other treated materials. Staged on a white or cream covered table, 24' wide X 30" deep displayed in front of a trifold provided by the exhibitor. Color and height of the trifold determined by the exhibitor. Design should not extend beyond the trifold.*

#### **Class 3: Dried** **(4 exhibits)**

*A wreath using all dried material, no fresh permitted to be staged on a tripod or hung. Maximum 24".*

#### **Class 4: A Functional Table Setting for One**

*“Cookies for Santa”*  
**(4 exhibits)**

*Should include placemat, napkin, beverage service, and dishes, with a flower arrangement in proportion to the table setting. No silverware. Staged on a white or cream covered table, 24' wide X 30" deep.*

#### **Class 5: Petit Design Ornaments** **(4 exhibits)**

*A miniature design, no larger than 6" in width, depth and height, using fresh/and or dried material staged on a pedestal table provided by the committee.*
